# NURSING

## LOUISIANA TECH UNIVERSITY

Licensed Practical Nurses who wish to pursue the Associate Degree in nursing may apply for admission to the Louisiana Tech University Division of Nursing Extension Program. An applicant who has been arrested, charged with, convicted of, pled guilty or no contest to, or been sentenced for any criminal offense in any state must petition the LSBN for permission to begin nursing courses.

### ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Applicants who meet the admission criteria and who are accepted by the Admissions Committee complete two TRANSITION COURSES (Nursing 100 & 113) to earn a total of 12 hours of nursing credits by examination. NOTE: Credit or enrollment in Nursing 100 Sect. 90 (offered only in Winter Quarter) is a pre-requisite for Nursing 113.

These self-paced transition courses include teacher-made exams, with clinical competency evaluations required for Nursing 113. Students pay regular Extension Course fees for this required course as well as all other nursing courses.

Prospective students are urged to seek academic counseling before starting prerequisite course work.

### ADMISSION CRITERIA

1. ACT Scores
2. High School, College or Vo-Tech Transcripts
3. Three (3) letters of reference
4. Evidence of LPN licensure in Louisiana
5. NLN – Pre Nursing and Guidance Examination
6. One-Year Work Experience as L.P.N.

This information must be forwarded to the Division of Nursing, Louisiana Tech University no later than December 1st for enrollment in the Spring Quarter.

Nursing 113 is offered once a year in the Spring Quarter. Students who complete the course satisfactorily are eligible to enroll in regular nursing courses beginning in the Fall Quarter.

Nursing courses are taught at the Glenwood Regional Medical Center Mall by Louisiana Tech University nursing faculty. These classes are usually conducted at times which enable students to continue in their work role.



### PREREQUISITE COURSES

Students must complete the following courses before enrolling in the Fall Quarter nursing course (Nursing 114).

1. Bio Sci 225, 226, 227 & 214 (Anatomy & Physiology & Bacteriology)
2. Math 101
3. Nursing 100
4. Nursing 113

Students are also urged to complete the remaining 18 hours General Academic Courses prior to Fall enrollment.

Students may transfer credit earned for these courses at other approved universities.

A minimum grade of "C" is required for each accepted transfer course. The Division of Nursing Office evaluates transcripts to determine credit which may be transferred.
