Admission Requirements:

1.	Possess a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited university.
2.	Have a 2.5 GPA, or higher, on undergraduate work.
3.	Pass the Pre-Professional Skills (Reading ____, Writing ____, and Mathematics ____) PRAXIS I examination OR be eligible to waive with acceptable ACT/SAT scores or Master's degree from approved university.
4.	Pass the PRAXIS II Music: Content Knowledge specialty examination.
5.	Present acceptable GRE scores.
6.	Develop and submit your teaching philosophy. See http://latech.edu/education/index.php?id=410 for more information.
7.	Submit your resume.
8.	Submit three letters of recommendation.
9.	Complete and submit a Professional Conduct Form.
10.	Interview with Department of Music Committee. Pass a performance audition and music theory diagnostic test. Candidates deficient in music teaching methodology may be advised to take undergraduate methods courses to become proficient.
11.	Complete a graduate application and submit to Graduate School with \$40.00 application fee.
Y/N	In addition to applying for a teaching certificate upon successful program completion, you may also apply for a post-degree certificate from Louisiana Tech University. Applicant must register for EDCI 598 at the beginning of the quarter in which certificate requirements are to be completed. Note: Courses completed from another institution cannot be applied to a Louisiana Tech Certificate.

A minimum of ½ of your load must be in your content area. Methods courses should be completed prior to the first quarter of internship. Additional M.A.T. Program Requirements:

Candidates may enter the program conditionally for one quarter only if they have a baccalaureate degree, 2.5 or higher UGPA, have passed PRAXIS I or are eligible to waive PRAXIS I, and have passed PRAXIS II Content. To register for a second quarter, candidates must submit required GRE scores. Candidates must achieve and maintain unconditional status in order for this plan of study to remain valid. If candidate is out one quarter, he/she must reapply using the one-page, no-fee readmission form. If candidate is out two or more quarters, he/she must reapply using the graduate application form and may be required to sign a new plan of study.

Substitute and transfer courses must have prior approval.

Candidates have received and understand that they are responsible for adhering to the procedures outlined in the New Candidate Information Sheet. (NCIS).

Candidates understand that this program requires successful completion of diverse field experiences which must be completed in public schools within the geographic area determined by the Louisiana Board of Regents: Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, Jackson, Lincoln, Monroe City, Ouachita, Union, and Webster Parishes. See NCIS and TaskStream for additional information.

Candidates understand deliberate falsification of this document may result in being dropped from the College.

Candidates must maintain a quarterly and cumulative 3.0 GPA on all course work. No grade lower than C and no more than two C's will be counted toward an MAT program.

Candidates are required to successfully complete a student teaching/intern electronic portfolio and submit it for evaluation via the TaskStream web-based toolset and assessment system prior to program completion. This e-portfolio must be submitted no later than the seventh week of the quarter for student teachers or by the fifth week of the winter quarter for interns.

Candidates are also required to successfully complete a second electronic portfolio (EDCI 599: MAT E-Portfolio) and submit it for evaluation via the TaskStream web-based toolset and assessment system prior to program completion. The MAT E-Portfolio must be submitted no later than the fourth week of the quarter of expected graduation, but may be submitted by the fourth week of the quarter immediately prior to the quarter of expected graduation.

During final quarter, the candidate must (1) apply for a teaching certificate in the Office of Field and Clinical Experiences, and (2) must register for graduation in the Registrar's Office.
