# ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES

To be accepted into the I/O Doctoral Program, applicants must first meet the minimal admission standards of the University and be accepted into the LA Tech Graduate School.

The admission requirements and deadlines are different for the Graduate School and the I/O Doctoral Program, and acceptance into the Graduate School does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Some program requirements for consideration include:

- Official record of GRE Verbal score and Quantitative score
- Minimum undergraduate GPA of 3.0
- Bachelor's degree in psychology, Master's degree in psychology, or 15 hours of psychology with at least 6 hours of statistics/research



The Industrial/Organizational Psychology Program prepares students to work in areas relating to applied behavioral science in organizations and business. Outside of class, students are given the opportunity to gain hands-on experience through involvement on various research and applied project teams with faculty supervision.

The doctoral program involves rigorous preparation in psychological foundations, research methods and statistical analysis, I/O Psychology, and successful completion and defense of a dissertation involving original research.



The program generally requires three to four years of full-time study post-baccalaureate. The actual amount of time needed varies depending on student prior preparation (a limited amount of credit may be requested for prior graduate work) and progress in the program. All students accepted into the program receive a graduate assistant ship with a stipend.
