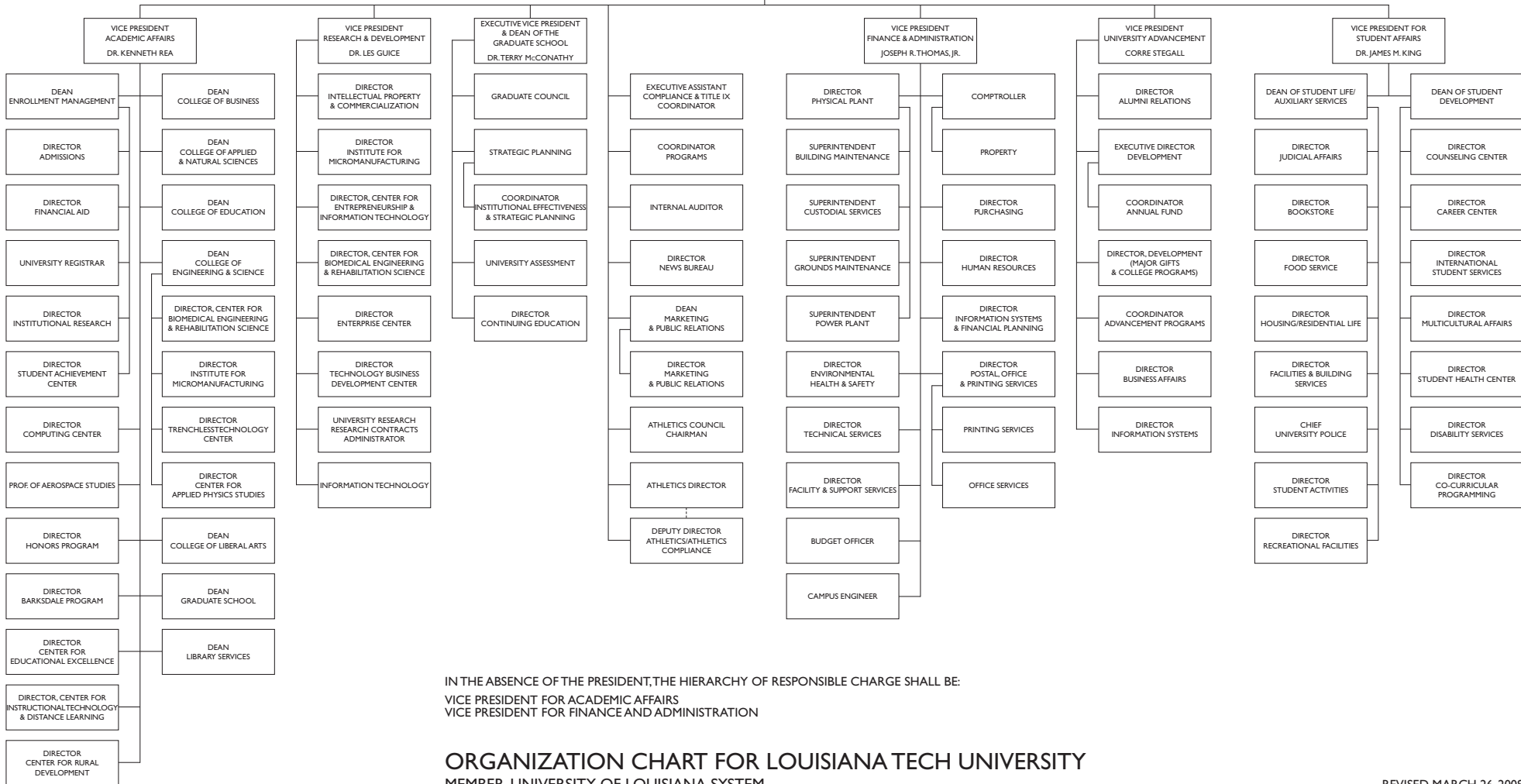

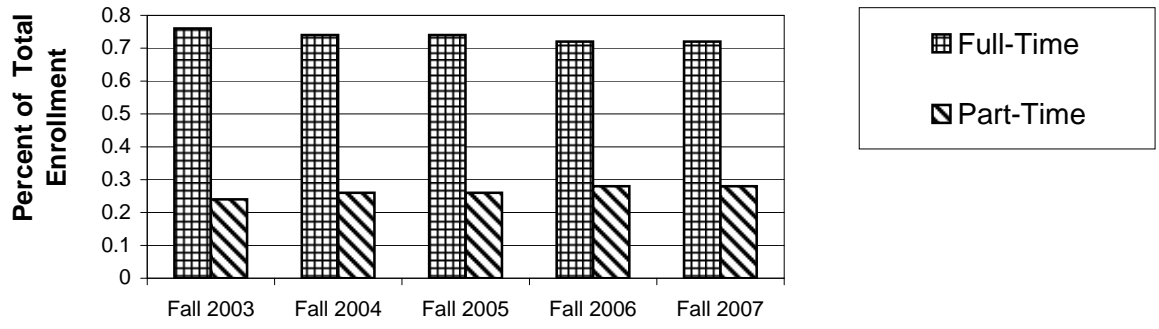

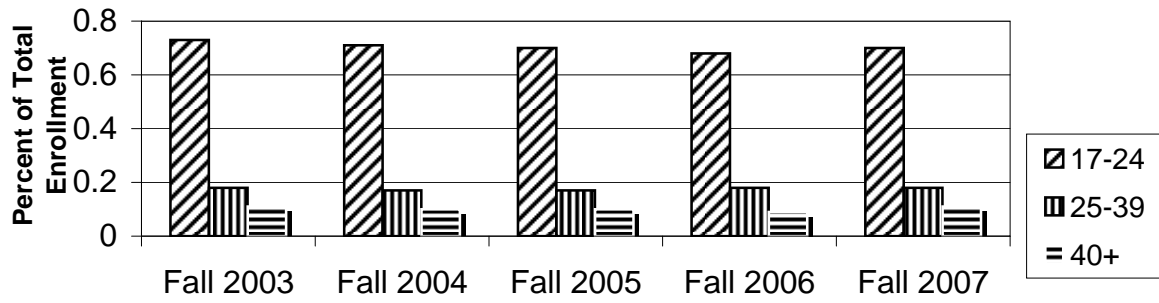




University Enrollment

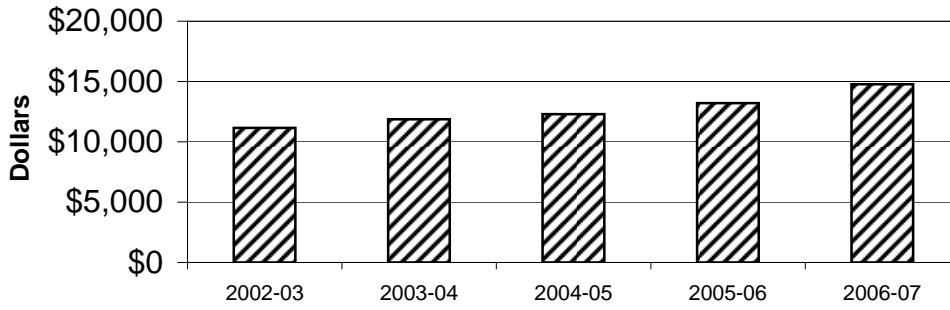

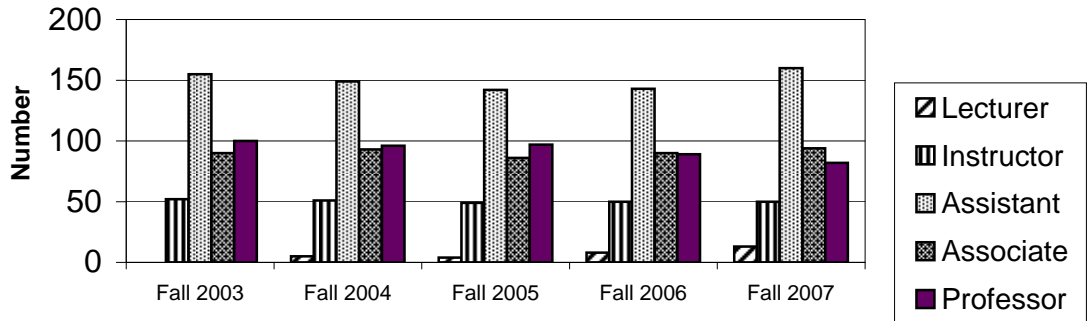

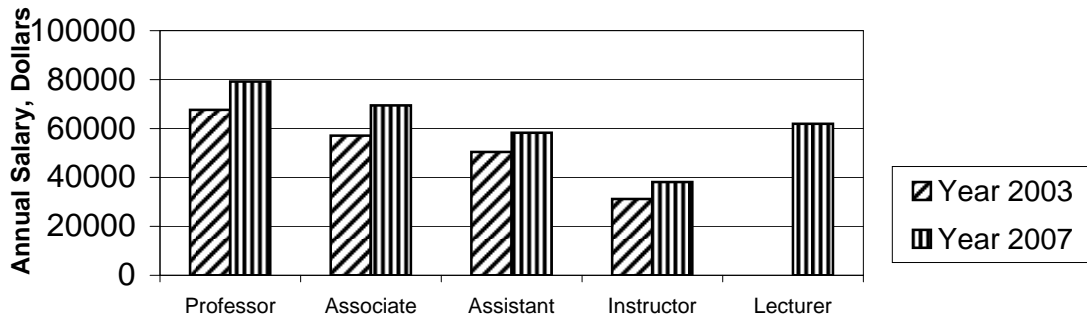

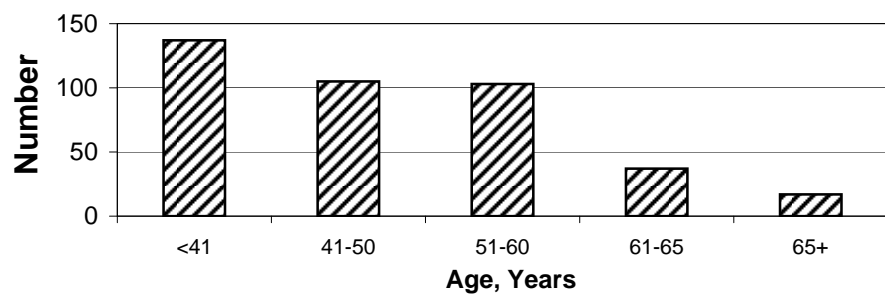
**Instructional Faculty
