Resources

The following resources are available from the Prescott Library homepage at www.latech.edu/library.

Searching for Books

Books available through Prescott Library can be accessed in by clicking on **Books** typing in a title, author, or keyword. You can also click on the link to the Library Catalog directly above the search box.

The Catalog will lists books, electronic books, government documents (federal and state), and periodical titles (not contents).

The library subscribes to several **Electronic Book collections**. The **NetLibrary** collection contains over 50,000 titles and can be accessed under the link **Books**. These books are also listed in the LaTech catalog by title, author, subject, and keyword. The **Knovel** collection contains the digitized version of over 500 engineering and science books whose contents are fully searchable, including tables and graphs.

2. Catalogs will give you the option of searching the Prescott Library catalog in addition to several others. Particularly useful is the **LOUISiana Libraries Union Catalog** which allows you to search the catalogs of other academic libraries from around the state.

WorldCat is a database for identifying books on your subject that are located in libraries around the world. It should enable you to verify the bibliographic information of the items you need (author, title, publisher, etc.) which you can then order through InterLibrary Loan.

Searching for Journal Articles

Finding journal articles on specific topics is fairly easy. Click on the link **Subject List**. Then click on one of the headings listed under **Engineering and Science**. Choose from over one dozen indexes available, most of which now contain at least some full text articles.

If you want to determine if the library has access to a particular journal, simply click on the link **Journals** under Quick Search. Type the title in the box then click on any available links to the full text, if available, and/or to a print version which will be found on the 3rd floor under the call number provided.

Gov Info

Clicking on this link will allow you to search for government information through the Prescott Library catalog. Moreover, you can access many useful sites listed under **Federal** websites. Some of the best sites for technical areas include the following:

Dissertations and Theses

Dissertations and masters theses written by graduates of Louisiana Tech University can be located by clicking on the link **More** then **Dissertations & Theses**. Type in a title, author, or keyword in the box to search the library catalog. One copy is available for checkout and will be located on the upper floors on the bookshelves. Dissertations and theses from other universities can be searched using the link to the database **Proquest Digital Dissertations**. Most of these are now available in full text.

Library Services

If Prescott Library does not own a book, a journal, or a conference proceeding paper, these materials can be ordered though **Interlibrary Loan (ILL)**. Additionally, the library has access to the document delivery service **ScienceDirect**, which enables individuals to order journal articles directly.

These services are available for free, but there are some restrictions. To register, please review the options and explanations provided under the heading **InterLibrary Services**.
