



Patents

Many patents can be found on web sites in full-text with diagrams. Some patents can be as long as 5,000 pages and use very specific legal terminology. Most databases allow for keyword searching in addition to publication number, inventor and applicant. *Some databases may require you to download applications to be able to view images or files.* Please note whether the patent you are searching for has a patent number or application number, this will determine which database to use. Patents can be searched for research purposes, however, if you are searching patents with the intent of applying for a patent, a patent attorney is highly recommended.

United States Patents (USPTO Web Site)

Patents can be found in full-text from 1976. Prior to 1976, only full-page images are available and patents must be searched by an issue date, patent number or U. S. classification code. The manual of classification is listed under Tools on the Patents web page and can be searched online to identify the applicable codes.

European Patents (European Patent Office)

The worldwide database is the most comprehensive as it covers patent applications from 72 countries. The EP and WIPO databases include patent applications published over the last 24 months. Search these databases for patents whose numbers may begin with WO, EP, CN or some other country code. Some patents may be in their original language with an English abstract.

Academic Universe/Lexis-Nexis Patents from the United States are available in full-text from 1971. There is limited access to the diagrams and drawings.
