

Accessibility to the Louisiana Tech Speech and Hearing Center For Clients and Students with Disabilities

It is the policy of Louisiana Tech University to make reasonable accommodations for individuals with documented disabilities in order for them to experience full participation in the activities, programs, and services of the University (<http://www.latech.edu/ODS>). Likewise, the Department of Speech maintains access for disabled clients and students who receive services through the Louisiana Tech Speech and Hearing Center which is housed in Robinson Hall on the University campus. Not all floors of Robinson Hall are accessible to individuals who are confined to the use of a wheelchair. However, the first floor which comprises the Speech and Hearing Center and the audiological (hearing) suites located in Woodard Hall are accessible.

It is the policy of the Department of Speech and the Louisiana Tech Speech and Hearing Center to accommodate disabled clients or students by providing clinical services within accessible parts of the facility. As needed, individuals may request additional consideration for accommodations through the Head of the Department of Speech/Director of the Louisiana Tech Speech and Hearing Center. The University Police provide shuttle service to Woodard Hall as needed for audiological (hearing) evaluations for disabled clients. The Clinical Supervisor will notify the Coordinator of Audiology Services of the need for shuttle service; the Coordinator will then make arrangements with the University Police. When advanced notification is not possible, completion of the audiological (hearing) evaluation may be delayed or have to be rescheduled.
