Dear University Senate Awards Committee,

I am honored to have been nominated for the 2018 Loyalty Award. Below is a brief narrative of my service to Louisiana Tech that will give you a glimpse of my loyalty for our University. Should you need additional information please let me know.

The first time I experienced Louisiana Tech was in June of 1994. I had graduated from high school and had plans to attend college with my best friend at LSU that fall. Fortunately for me, my mom had many friends whose children attended Louisiana Tech, and she strongly encouraged me to schedule a visit. I agreed, but we were not spending the night in Ruston. After my visit I thought, I might as well give this place a try. The people there were kind, the campus was clean, and I liked the professors I had the opportunity to meet in the College of Business. Wanting to remain in control of the situation, I only agreed to one quarter with the thought I could always move back home. Well, it has almost been a quarter of a century and my experiences from that first taste of the Tech Family to my job today have been tremendous!

My involvement as a student in various campus activities and organizations allowed me to develop relationships with the administration as well as with the faculty and staff. I made it a priority to get to know the people on campus whether it was Frank who helps keep the grounds looking good, or Mrs. Virginia who makes the delicious desserts in the cafeteria, or those in administration like Dr. Jean Hall who was always providing advice and encouragement. Developing these relationships was important, but getting valuable work experience was also a priority for me. Seeing an advertisement in The Tech Talk for an advertising sales representative was what lead me to my first job at Tech—selling ads for The Tech Talk. After one quarter as a college student, things were going great in all areas of my life. I knew Tech was the place for me! During my second quarter at Tech, I was promoted to Advertising Manager of the Tech Talk, where I served until graduation in November of 1998. This position provided me with an opportunity to work with not only those on campus but the entire Ruston business community. Who knew selling ads for the school newspaper would lead me to my next "job" at Louisiana Tech—Orientation Student Leader.

Having created the advertisement seeking applications for Orientation Student Leaders I thought, "This would be a great way to share my love for Louisiana Tech," so I applied and was selected to be member of the 1997 Summer OSL Staff. We worked many hours as a staff but I enjoyed every aspect of the experience. The following summer I was selected to serve as the Parent Orientation Leader, where I had the opportunity to interact not only with students but their parents as well. This position provided me with another opportunity to serve what would soon become my alma mater. Little did I know when I began that position that the Director of Orientation would be moving at the end of the summer, which lead to my first full time job at Louisiana Tech, Director of Orientation and Recruiter. Was I excited? Just a little! I had the opportunity to remain at Tech and recruit students to come to the place that helped mold me into the young professional that I had become. It was truly a blessing. Spending the fall on the road sharing the exciting happenings at Tech with high school students and their parents at college fairs, while during the winter and spring, I was busy preparing for orientation and showing prospective students and their parents campus. That campus tour that I took back in 1994, was what changed my life. I was thrilled to be able to share my experiences at Tech with future

Bulldogs. Summer, of course, was filled with overseeing the Summer Orientation program where incoming freshmen flooded the campus learning all they could as they begin their journey as a college student.

My love for Louisiana Tech was strong and I hated to make a move, but the time had come early in 2001. I knew I wanted to continue my education while gaining valuable professional experience. The opportunity to serve as the Assistant Director of Admission at another university presented itself with the opportunity to purse a Master's degree. This opportunity was not a great fit for me, nor was I going to be able to reach my goal of obtaining a Master's degree. Therefore, with much thought and consideration I resigned to be able to pursue my degree full time later that year. After visiting a number of schools, I had the opportunity to return to the place I called home, Louisiana Tech. I pursued my Master's in Business Administration while gaining valuable work experience serving as the graduate assistant in the Division of University Advancement. Dr. Jean Hall and Corre Stegall provided me with an opportunity that would propel me into the next chapter of my life. I was encouraged, mentored, and taught all the aspects of the Alumni Association and the University Foundation. I never dreamed that I would spend thirteen years as a part of the team that shared the good news of Louisiana Tech with alumni across the country. serving first as Coordinator of Alumni Programs and later as Director of Alumni Relations. What a wonderful way for me to be able to continue to serve the place that I am so fond of – my alma mater.

Then the opportunity to continue to serve our University in a different, but very important way, was presented to me. Reggie Hanchey was retiring after thirty-five years of service. This left Dr. Guice with the task of finding someone to assist him in the President's Office. What a natural transition for me as I knew most of the staff on campus and our alums across the country. I was honored to be considered for this critical role and enthusiastically accepted the position in May 2014. It has been such a pleasure for me to work with and for a man that loves his University the way Dr. Guice loves Louisiana Tech. His example has strengthened my loyalty for our great University. Being loyal requires you to be willing to do whatever it takes to accomplish the task of making Louisiana Tech the best University it can be. For me that could mean planning events for distinguished guest, visiting with alumni/donors, serving on committees to plan for the future development/beautification of campus, or even task as simple as picking up trash as I walk across campus. Each day I strive to make Louisiana Tech a better place for our students, faculty, staff and for generations to come.

I look forward to many more years of service to Louisiana Tech and I will truly "Ever Loyal Be to the My Alma Mater."
