OBSERVABLE MENTAL/BEHAVIORAL HEALTH	RISK LEVEL	GUIDELINES FOR RESPONSE
<p>Distress</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emotionally troubled • Individuals impacted by situational stressors/traumatic events • May be psychiatrically symptomatic 	<p>MILD</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Possible intervention by reporter or administrator • Verbal behavioral contract • Conflict management, mediation, problem solving • Consider consultation with appropriate faculty/administration
<p>Disturbance</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Behaviorally disruptive, unusual, and/or bizarrely acting • Destructive, concern about harm to self or others • Indications of substance abuse • Negative changes in hygiene and/or self care 	<p>MODERATE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Possible intervention by reporter or administrator • Behavioral contract • Conflict management (unless student is violent), mediation, problem solving • Evaluate parental/guardian notification • Evaluate need to request permission from student to receive medical/educational records • Consider referral for mandated assessment • Consider consultation with appropriate faculty/administration
<p>Dysregulation/Medically Disabled</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suicidal • Destructive, apparent harm to self/others • Engaging in risk-taking behaviors (i.e. substance abuse) • Hostile, aggressive, relationally abusive • Individual deficient in skills that regulate emotion, cognition, self behavior, relationships 	<p>SEVERE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intervention by reporter or administrator • Parental/guardian notification obligatory unless contraindicated • Evaluate emergency notification to others (FERPA/Clery) • No behavioral contracts • Consultation with appropriate faculty/administrator • Possible referral to Behavioral Standards • Possible liaison with law enforcement to compare red flags • Referral for mandated assessment • Consider voluntary/involuntary medical withdrawal • Consider referral for involuntary commitment • Law enforcement response • Consultation with legal counsel
