STATEMENT OF BELIEFS

I am extremely humbled and honored to represent Louisiana Tech’s College of Education on a daily basis doing what I love most – recruiting teaching majors and walking alongside future teachers in their journey towards teacher certification. Since returning to my alma mater in 1999, I have had the opportunity to collaborate with some of our university’s finest professors as well as hundreds of educators across the nation. I consider learning a life-long process continually revising courses while searching for best teaching practices.

My key professional areas of interest are children’s literature and clinical experiences. In 2015, I began work with the International Literacy Association and The Children’s Book Council as one of five sites in the country researching best books for children. I’m currently the co-chair of the Children’s Choices Committee. This work has established the Student Resource Center library on the 2nd floor of Woodard Hall with more than 5,000 circulating books for our students, faculty, partner districts and the community. We also have a Children’s Choices room with approximately 1,000 new publications on reserve for research purposes annually. This project also provided more than 14,000 new books for schools in Lincoln Parish, Monroe City, and Jackson Parish School Districts.

My current passion is conducting action research to support the national shift from traditional student teaching to a more prestigious and rigorous full-year clinical residency program. Through extensive data collection, professional clinical experience, and traveling across the country speaking on panels and conferences, we developed College of Education’s TEAM (Teacher Educators and Mentors) Model as a rich, research-based framework to establish a clinical residency program at Louisiana Tech University. In the fall of 2015, the Clinical Residency & Recruitment Center was established in Woodard Hall, and to date, we have trained over 400 mentor teachers, coached 250 residents, and developed rich K-12 partnerships with 12 school districts including our own A.E. Phillips Laboratory School and the Tech Early Childhood Education Center. I believe the national recognition for our work in Woodard is directly aligned with similar passions across our campus, all striving to be our best. I feel very passionate about sharing our success stories through social media and our website.

In my 20th year as a professor at Louisiana Tech, I’m still in awe of our ever-changing profession as teacher preparation programs across the nation move from a traditional student teaching experience to a more prestigious full-year clinical residency program. In his famous book, *The Dot*, Children’s author/illustrator Peter H. Reynolds reminds us to “make your mark, and see where it takes you.” I can honestly say the professional challenges in the past five years have been extremely rigorous, but they have also been the most exciting in my career. The support from my university, college, and family has been overwhelming, and I truly believe that Louisiana Tech’s College of Education will continue to receive state and national recognition for its visionary educators collaborating together to revolutionize best practices for teacher preparation.

NOTE: I did not have access to all course evaluations due to the quarantine. LSCI course evaluations averaged 3.9 prior to the new evaluation system. Since, no more than 2-4 students in class completed the new evaluation system, and the average rating was approximately 3.2. Other courses are field-based with professional development including guest speakers and have not been traditionally evaluated.

SELECTED FUNDED PROJECTS



From 2015 – 2020, I've submitted 14 grant proposals with 100% success rate of funding. Since 2015, I have led our team in securing **\$619,000.00** in grant funding through 12 separate Louisiana Believe and Prepare programs. Funds provided the opportunity to (1) establish the Clinical Residency & Recruitment Center, (2) provide mentor training to more than 400 educators across the I-20 corridor, (3) transition traditional student teaching to a full-year residency program, and (4) create innovative clinical coaching through SWIVL technology, and (5) support mentors and residents during the transition with a variety of needed resources.

Additionally, Lagniappe Ladies provided **\$10,000** in two awards providing Praxis resources to teacher candidates across all certification programs and hundreds of children's literature for our Dogs with a Cause Program. As the Director of the CRRC, we have been honored with an additional **\$4,000** in funding to provide children's literature to area schools.
