I strongly recommend Lisa Elam for the Loyalty Award - Classified. During the past 20 years, I have had the opportunity to work with Lisa closely in Counseling Services and as a colleague as she worked for the Air Force ROTC program and the Office of the Provost.

First of all, let me describe the person and heart of Lisa Elam. She is true and loyal to her beliefs and convictions and gets along easily with all groups and cultures of people. Lisa genuinely enjoys meeting people, helping people, and is friendly, outgoing, and can talk to anyone. She is organized and follows through on all of her projects. She is committed to following rules, policies, and procedures.

For several years Lisa assisted me on a daily basis to keep my professional life and the administration of Counseling Services in order. She was committed to make me and the Office of Counseling Services successful and effective. She has an ability to anticipate what is needed to be done. An organized helper, she wants to see the job get done...and done right! Lisa is conscientious, cooperative, and honestly concerned about others' experiences and affairs.

One example stands out to me. While working in Counseling Services, Lisa served as the Coordinator of Clinical and Administrative Services. Lisa spent time in the Career Center to cover the needs there. She was not instructed to do so. Because she was loyal devoted, she stepped in as a hardworking and cooperative team member.

I am honored to have the opportunity to write this letter in support of Lisa Elam who is a nominee for the Loyalty Award – Classified. I had the opportunity to work with Lisa for over twenty years before we each moved on to other Tech divisions and departments. I first worked with Lisa in the Louisiana Tech Counseling Services. Her role, in part, was to greet students who were seeking counseling and to begin the intake process prior to their counseling appointment. I observed Lisa with students, both referred and self-referred, and noted her manner was calm, courteous, and assuring. She helped to make the experience a safe and positive one for each student client.

As Lisa advanced in position, she and I would occasionally collaborate on a project. In 2007, the Division of Student Affairs conceived, planned, and implemented the First Year Experience Convocation. My colleagues and I had hopes for this to be a memorable annual event for our newest bulldogs, faculty, and staff. The project required approximately 100 volunteers from various departments to assist. Lisa volunteered to assist in seating the hundreds of first year students. Each year following, she volunteered with the intricate seating arrangements for that program until it became clear she knew the task better than anyone. Thereafter she was the supervisor for other faculty and staff volunteers. Not only did she create an efficient strategy for seating, but she also demonstrated kindness in insisting that the students were warmly welcomed at their first campus event, making it one they would remember.

Lisa's pride in all things Tech is well known. She was once recruited as an exhibitor by a Student Affairs department head to travel to the state counseling conference to promote Louisiana Tech services. On another occasion I was planning a meeting with a professional on an extremely sensitive subject. I made a request to Dean Ford, which was granted, for Lisa to accompany me to the session so she could note the important dialogue. She observed, took notes, and presented me with a transcript the next day. Never was I concerned about her discretion. My observation has been that Lisa will participate in events, and perform duties with no expectation of her gain, if students will benefit.

Lisa's kindness is her hallmark and caring is just part of her being. She is an active church member and community advocate. She volunteered for several years with Life Choices so that young women and their partners could build skills in vital decision making about family. Lisa's leadership with Junior Auxiliary has contributed to the success in JA's ability to support numerous programs for the community. She conceived, organized, and hosted monthly luncheons for retirees and those still in service as an opportunity for interaction. In Student Affairs we were implored to be kind, caring, and committed. Lisa embodies all these traits.

Lisa has modeled for other administrative employees by seeking additional training, education, and experience, which benefited the university and resulted in her well-deserved advancement. In addition to pride for her profession Lisa clearly models Tech Pride in enthusiastically promoting projects such as Loyal Blue Fridays.
