It is my pleasure to nominate Regina Foster for the University Senate Loyalty Award. Regina is an exceptional member of the Prescott Memorial Library team and her contributions to Louisiana Tech University are endless.

Through her hard work, dedication, and loyalty she serves as an example to all. Her career spans over 25 years having served in multiple capacities as a Library Specialist 2, Library Specialist 3, and Library Specialist Supervisor all within the User Services Department. As a Library Specialist Supervisor, she oversees all public service functions within circulation and interlibrary loan and supervises the work of three Library Specialists, graduate assistants, and student workers within the User Services Department. Last year she helped to create a new night/weekend Library Specialist position to coordinate technology gear, handle building maintenance and security issues and oversee public service functions in circulation, research services and serials on a night/weekend basis.

Please consider this letter a recommendation in support of Regina Foster's nomination for the University Senate Loyalty Award – Classified.

Regina began working at Prescott Library as a freshman student assistant in the Circulation Department. She is a Tech alumna with an undergraduate degree in Psychology and a Master of Arts in Industrial/Organizational Psychology. At this point in her career, she has advanced to being the Library Specialist Supervisor of the User Services (Circulation) Department. In this position, she supervises three full time employees, three graduate students, and six or more student assistants.

The User Services Department is a highly service-oriented area. The staff members are readily visible as students, faculty, and visitors enter the building, and are usually the first staff members to interact with the public. As a member of this department, Regina is not responsible for giving reference assistance or dealing with printer or computer issues, however, she is always able to refer a patron to the appropriate librarian or staff member who can answer the question, and she goes above and beyond what is required of her position.

Regina has been a valuable resource to Prescott Library for 25 years. One of her greatest strengths is the management of Prescott's Inter-Library Loan Service. There are frequent occasions when a faculty member has a need for a journal or resource that we do not own, and when we turn it over to Regina, she finds it almost instantly, borrows it, and makes it available to the patron. There is a need for tact and patience when a researcher is frustrated by time restraints and the inability to locate materials. Regina handles these situations well, and in our annual library survey, she is always mentioned as being helpful, polite, and resourceful.

Regina certainly exemplifies all of the qualities that this award was created to acknowledge. She is truly deserving of it, and I hope that she will be considered and rewarded for her outstanding contribution to Louisiana Tech University.
