Dear University Senate Committee Members:

Being nominated for the 2023-2024 Outstanding Service Award for classified staff is an honor. I am grateful beyond measure for this nomination. Louisiana Tech University has many wonderful, talented, and dedicated classified staff members, and I know that my nomination is partly due to how others have shown outstanding service to me.

It is nothing short of luck that I began working at Louisiana Tech University. During the summer of 2006, I was looking for a job, having been a homemaker for some time. I stopped by the Louisiana Tech Bookstore a week or so before the Fall Quarter began because I remembered my Great Aunt telling me how she worked part-time during the holidays and other busy periods of the year and had always enjoyed it. Luckily for me, the bookstore needed some temp workers for the upcoming busy Fall Quarter. The timing could not have been better, and I was offered a job and asked to start the day following the Labor Day holiday. I accepted the job (I am eternally thankful to you, Colleen Durrett), and that's where it all began.

Initially, I did not plan to take a Civil Service test or even consider applying for a full-time job at Louisiana Tech. However, after experiencing the infectious energy of the Fall Quarter, seeing the activities in and around campus, building relationships, and interacting with students, faculty, and staff who shopped and worked at the bookstore, I couldn't help but feel I was where I needed to be. After working part-time for a little over a year, I finally decided to take the Civil Service test, and I also decided to apply for a position in the bookstore that became vacant. The timing was less than great because this decision to apply for full-time employment coincided with a state-wide hiring freeze. So, while I waited, I continued working part-time until the hiring freeze lifted. I became a full-time employee at the Louisiana Tech Bookstore on August 8th, 2008. Working at the Louisiana Tech Bookstore was a valuable opportunity. It helped shape and prepare me for everything I have done since at Louisiana Tech.

In the summer of 2011, I applied for and accepted an Administrative Coordinator 3 position with the Department of Professional Aviation. Despite being unsure of what my new position would ask of me, I was welcomed and brought on board with open arms. The faculty and staff took me under their wings and guided me along the way (sincerest thanks for your patience, Mary Green). One unaltered component of my new appointment was I still had limitless opportunities to connect with the students, faculty, and staff. Later on, once I settled in, I felt re-energized and delighted by the challenges in this new environment. Numerous opportunities for professional growth presented themselves, and I hungered to learn more, do more, and, more importantly, help more. Being in that position provided substantial and beneficial grounds for growth and development that I still utilize. I found a tremendous source of pride and enjoyment during my time in that position with the longstanding friendships I established with alums, parents, students, both former and current, as well as faculty and staff.

After nearly five years in the Department of Professional Aviation, I moved once more briefly before taking a position as the Administrative Assistant 5 in the Office of Academic Affairs in November of 2015. The knowledge I gained while working in the Academic Affairs Office has had the most impact on my career at Louisiana Tech University. Within six months of taking the position, the office was down by one staff member, and the ability to find a suitable replacement was not on the horizon. Many of the tasks previously split by three office personnel fell on the shoulders of two. Without hesitation, I felt inspired to help and assist wherever possible. I rolled up my sleeves, despite being unsure if I would even know where to begin, and dug in. Through it all, I found confidence and strength thanks to the much-needed encouragement and mentorship of others (my deepest gratitude to Dr.Terry McConathy and Carrie Flournoy). These new challenges afforded me a chance to participate and work alongside many strong and dedicated faculty and staff from various levels of administration, which brought me experiences that were unknown to me. I continued assisting students, faculty, and staff whenever I could. I find pride in helping resolve an issue, no matter how big or how small, whether personal or professional. I find it just as rewarding now as I did then to assist people in any way possible.

In 2018, I accepted the position of Administrative Assistant 5 in the Office of the President. Moving into this position helped me to expand my involvement with faculty, staff, alums, parents, and visitors from all walks of life. I like to tell people that my job is consistently inconsistent, and it truly is. One day is never like the next, yet each day is as important as the other. I have witnessed many memorable and vital connections in this office between the current president, Dr. Henderson, and the former president, Dr. Guice. Each event, each person, and each meeting all have a purpose. I don't think we would have what we do at Louisiana Tech University without the care, devotion, and commitment we try to infuse into every interaction.

Once again, I would like to express my gratitude for being nominated for this award. Most importantly, I'd like to say this letter is more of a "thank you" from me to everyone who has ever demonstrated outstanding service and played an essential role in helping me develop and grow in my roles at Louisiana Tech University.
