I am incredibly honored to be nominated for the 2023-2024 Outstanding Service Award—Unclassified. Our campus is a cohesive community that fosters student excellence, and to be recognized for being a small part of it is humbling.

In September 2016, I began teaching at Louisiana Tech, starting an incredible journey. My dream is to positively impact students, and I found a new sense of joy in being in the classroom. These experiences opened up opportunities for me to network with faculty and staff across campus while mentoring future professionals. I also earned my Ed.D. and joined the Tech alumni family!

I became the Director of the Center for Instructional Technology in January 2023 and was able to share my love for technology with Louisiana Tech faculty and staff. I led the implementation of the Canvas learning management system. I have offered over 30 Canvas training sessions, both on-campus and online, to over 315 faculty and staff. I have also manually migrated over 675 courses to Canvas and assisted with the formal migration of over 1,500 courses. To better support faculty and students, I created a knowledge base of frequently asked questions. I also designed a Quality Matters-aligned course to assist faculty in meeting requirements for effective course design.

While I enjoy the responsibilities of my position, I experience great delight in being part of the larger Louisiana Tech community. For three years, I have worked with the 'ULS Bridging the Divide Summer Series,' serving as the Canvas Content Expert and working extensively with artificial intelligence, sharing what I learned with faculty and staff on the revamped CIT website. In the last year, I have been involved in the SACSCOC Quality Enhancement Plan process. I co-organized the '#EMPOWER Mini-Conference' and 'Canvas Con.' I have volunteered for Midnight Breakfast and Professors in the Plaza, served as a judge for the Lincoln Parish Teacher of the Year, been the scorekeeper for the Science Olympiad for several years, and never pass up a chance to judge the Louisiana Tech Undergraduate Research Symposium!

In summary, I am incredibly grateful to be nominated for this award. I appreciate your consideration and the opportunities I have been given as a Louisiana Tech University employee.
