- The Center for Entrepreneurship and Information Technology (CEnIT) which established an innovative entrepreneurship program along with classes, seminars, and yearly business plan competitions. The center upgraded faculty desktop PC's and networking equipment.
- The Louisiana Optical Network Initiative (LONI) delivered high speed networking to our campus (May 2007). This created many opportunities such as building out a data center in Davison Hall to host high performance research computers (BlueDawg and Painter) and a data backup facility for Louisiana state agencies and universities located in the hurricane impact zone.
- Transitioning classes to remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic while ensuring continuity with minimal disruption. This required training both students and faculty and deploying necessary software tools so classroom instruction could continue seamlessly.

I have inherited many projects during my career and the one I find most rewarding is managing my team of student workers at the 24-Hour print lab. Guiding these students not only keeps me grounded as a staff member but also serves as a constant reminder of our primary focus—supporting our students.

Personally, Louisiana Tech University holds a special place in my heart. As a first-generation college graduate (1992), I not only earned my undergraduate degree here but met my wife, Elizabeth (1992), during that time. Now both of our children are following in our footsteps as Louisiana Tech students. My passion for this university extends beyond IT support and academics—I am a devoted Bulldog fan and can often be seen cheering on our teams at sporting events. Louisiana Tech is not just a workplace or school to me, it's a cherished part of my family's story and a community I proudly support.

It is with pleasure I write this letter supporting Mr. Chris Womack for the Outstanding Service Award, for he exemplifies the kind of individual this award was meant to recognize.

I have collaborated with Mr. Womack on a variety of projects over the years – from coordinating online speakers to planning major regional events. Through his actions during each of these events, Mr. Womack continually embodied the spirit of service – to give freely, to lead effortlessly, and to innovate continually. A bit of context: I first collaborated with Mr. Womack to plan a series of online talks for the LA Tech and Ruston communities. I have since worked with Mr. Womack to coordinate a variety of events – from scheduling two different hybrid visiting speaker series to organizing a major conference on the Tech campus. His actions and attitude during these undertakings was nothing short of inspirational; in fact, they often inspired others working with him to become exemplars of true, selfless service as well.

Throughout the various projects, Mr. Womack and I worked on over the years, he never said "No" or "I can't do that." Not once; not ever – no matter how challenging the task. Rather, his attitude was always one of "I will find a way!" And every time, he did. No matter what the challenge involved, Mr. Womack gave 110% to make sure things happened. On several occasions, he stepped in to address a major technology issue that occurred in the middle of a visiting speaker's talk, and during these high-pressure and time-sensitive instances, he remained calm and collected, put the speaker and the audience at ease, and quickly and effectively diagnosed and addressed the problem. In another situation, Mr. Womack coordinated all of the technology needed to effectively create a hybrid version of a major state conference – which included quickly and effectively addressing different technical, logistical, and other situations as they arose.

What makes such feats truly remarkable is the attitude Mr. Womack maintained throughout every project and task, no matter how onerous it was. In every interaction he has with others – be they a visiting scholar, a student, or anyone else – Mr. Womack patiently and sincerely listens. He will fully listen to visitor complaints and concerns and immediately enact a solution – no matter how difficult the request. (Example: He came up with a last-minute solution to allow for the Zoom broadcasting of a keynote address only moments after learning the location of the address had been moved!)

Through his dedication to helping his fellow persons, his continual optimistic cheer, and his focus on true actions over hollow words, Mr. Womack represents what all of us should try to achieve through serving others in all we do. He is an incredible member of the LA Tech community, and we are all better due to Mr. Womack being a part of our campus. In truth, he is the ideal person whose work should be acknowledged with the Outstanding Service Award.
