Respondus LockDown Browser (LDB)

Purpose

The Respondus LockDown Browser is a restricted web browser used to aid in assurance of the academic integrity of quizzes and exams. When students access exams through LDB, they are prevented from performing certain actions such as launching other applications, switching to other windows, opening unapproved websites, and printing or copying test questions.

For Faculty: Instructional Considerations

While using LDB is helpful in deterring some casual misconduct, LDB alone is not sufficient to prevent cheating. In a day where most students have at least a laptop and smartphone, using a second device to cheat is a trivial exercise. As a result, LDB is should only be considered as a single tool within a larger strategy for assuring academic integrity. LDB is best paired with some type of test-taking behavior monitoring such as traditional proctoring or through electronic proctoring using tools such as ProctorU (live) or Respondus Monitor (automated).

Since LDB is most frequently used to protect multiple-choice exams, you may wish to consider whether or not a multiple-choice examination is the most effective assessment in the first place. Consider the objectives of your course and the learning you wish to assess and consider whether multiple choice questions are suitable. Alternate assessments that require more knowledge synthesis may be less susceptible to cheating and can encourage, rather than forbid, the appropriate use of reference materials in problem solving.

If you decide that multiple-choice questions are appropriate, consider that constructing a good multiple-choice exam can take some work. For tips and strategies for designing a good multiple-choice exam, see the following resources:

If you use LDB in your course, it is strongly recommended that you include information about LDB in your syllabus. Additionally, **it is recommended that you create a practice exam in the course that students can use for testing LDB** *prior* **to a real exam**. It may help to assign a small point value to this assignment to ensure students perform tests early in the course.

For Faculty: Requiring LockDown Browser for Quizzes/Exams

Step 1: Create your quiz(es) or exam(s) normally.

Step 2: Add the Respondus LockDown Browser Dashboard to your course.

- Navigate to the **Course Dashboard** in your Moodle course.
- Click the "Edit blocks" button.
- Select "Respondus LockDown Browser" from the "Add a block" menu.
- Click "Turn editing off".

Step 3: Set the requirement in the Respondus LockDown Browser Dashboard.

- Navigate to the **Course Dashboard** in your Moodle course.
- Click the "Dashboard ..." link under "Respondus LockDown Browser".
- You will be taken to the About LockDown Browser page by default. Select "Continue to LockDown Browser" to proceed. You may also select the checkbox "Don't show this page again" if you prefer to be taken directly to the dashboard in the future.
- Click the drop-down arrow next to the quiz for which you wish to enable LockDown Browser and click the "**Settings**" link.
